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| 4. COMPOSTABLE YARD WASTE,
LOCAL MUNICIPAL COLLECTION BY-LAWS | 7 |
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May 23, 2003, recommending that:

1. The nine local municipalities be requested to:
 - 1.1 Review their respective collection by-laws and make any necessary amendments, as soon as possible, to ban compostable yard waste to prevent it from being mixed in and collected with disposable solid waste.

- 1.2 Develop and implement effective enforcement procedures with respect to this aspect of their collection by-laws.
2. Regional staff be directed to assist the staff of the local municipalities in drafting appropriate wording for the by-law amendments and in developing the associated by-law enforcement procedures.

5. PROPOSED PILOT PROJECT REUSE PROGRAM AT THE GEORGINA TRANSFER STATION 13

May 22, 2003, recommending that Regional staff:

1. Develop plans and select a partner for a reuse program as a one-year pilot project at the Region's Solid Waste Transfer Station in Georgina commencing in the fall of 2003, as outlined in this report.
2. Report back to the Committee regarding details of the program prior to launching the program.

6. PROPOSED OPERATING CONTRACTORS WASTE MANAGEMENT FACILITIES IN VAUGHAN 21

May 23, 2003, recommending that:

1. Clean Harbors Canada, Inc. be retained to operate the Household Hazardous Waste Depot in the City of Vaughan for the period of July 1 to December 31, 2003 at an estimated cost of \$127,000.00 (which includes 7% GST).
2. Miller Waste Systems be retained to operate the Small Vehicle Transfer Station in the City of Vaughan for the period of July 1 to December 31, 2003 at an estimated cost of \$234,000.00 (which includes 7% GST).
3. The provisions of the Region's Purchasing By-law No. A-0304-2002-031 be waived, for reasons as outlined in this report, to allow the above-referenced contractors to be retained.
4. Regional staff be directed to apply to the Ministry of the Environment for an amendment to the Certificate of Approval for the above facilities, which would name the Region rather than the City of Toronto as the operator of the facilities.

7. SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT BRANCH REORGANIZATION 27

May 20, 2003, recommending that:

1. Regional Council increase the staffing complement in the Solid Waste Management Branch by three full time equivalents (FTEs) effective August 1, 2003 as indicated in *Attachment 2*.
