

**NOTICE OF NEIGHBOURHOOD INFORMATION SESSION**

**CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT STUDY  
GLENWAY RESERVOIR EXPANSION PROJECT**

**Town of Newmarket**

The Regional Municipality of York (York Region) initiated a Schedule B Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study to expand the existing storage capacity of the Glenway Reservoir, located on Kirby Crescent in the Town of Newmarket, under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (October 2000, as amended in October 2007). York Region's Water and Wastewater Master Plan Update (November 2009) indicated the existing reservoir requires expansion to meet increased demands in the central and west areas of the Town of Newmarket.

The purpose of this Class EA study is to determine the preferred option to increase the existing storage capacity of the Glenway Reservoir to meet the growing needs of residents and businesses in the central and west areas of Newmarket. The Glenway Reservoir site was initially designed to allow for a second reservoir to be constructed once needs exceeded the storage capacity of the existing reservoir.

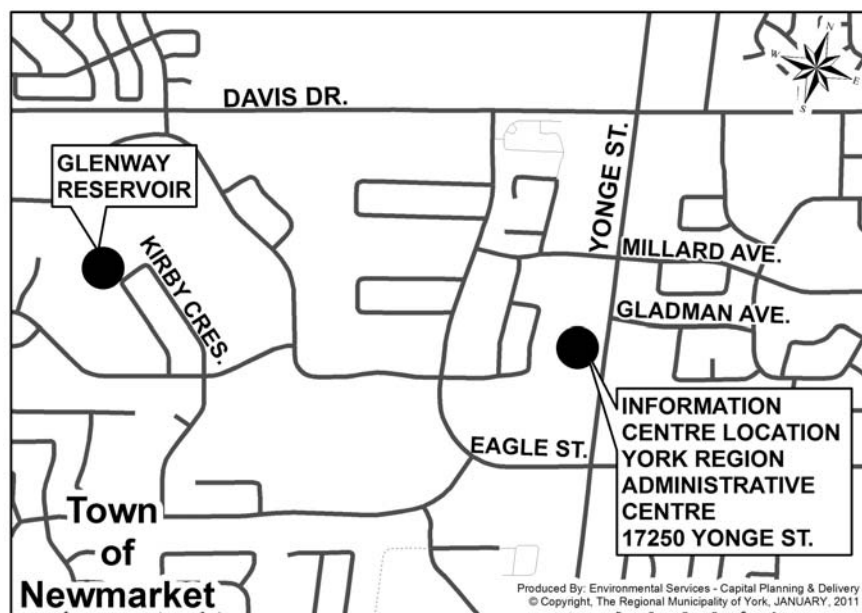

Representatives from York Region and the project study team will be present to answer questions and discuss the next steps in the study. Comments received at this information session will be considered in the assessment of alternatives and the selection of a recommended solution.
