

NOTICE OF PUBLIC WORKSHOP

TAKING THE WASTE OUT OF WASTEWATER

The Regional Municipality of York (York Region) has identified a Water Reclamation Centre with additional infrastructure as the preferred alternative to address the future sewage servicing needs of the Towns of Aurora, East Gwillimbury and Newmarket. A Water Reclamation Centre would treat wastewater from approved growth in East Gwillimbury and a portion of Newmarket in the Lake Simcoe watershed, using environmentally sustainable wastewater purification and water recycling technologies.

Wastewater from approved growth in Aurora and the remainder of Newmarket would be conveyed to the existing York Durham Sewage System (YDSS) for treatment and discharge to Lake Ontario, requiring modifications to the existing YDSS in Aurora and Newmarket.
