At 8 p.m. on Saturday, March 29<sup>th</sup>, the world will turn off its lights for just one hour – Earth Hour – to show support for taking action on climate change.

Earth Hour is a global initiative started by the World Wildlife Fund (WWF). More than 15 major cities are participating globally and in Canada – with more joining daily.

The Regional Municipality of York is a registered participant of Earth Hour and we will be turning-off all non-essential lights at the Administrative Centre and other regional facilities where possible on March 29<sup>th</sup>.

All employees, households, and businesses are encouraged to participate and turn off your lights for one hour from 8 p.m. to 9 p.m.

We encourage you to turn off your lights at home and in your office for Earth Hour.

We ask that you turn off your computer monitors before you leave for the end of the week. We also encourage you to tell your friends and family about this great event.
