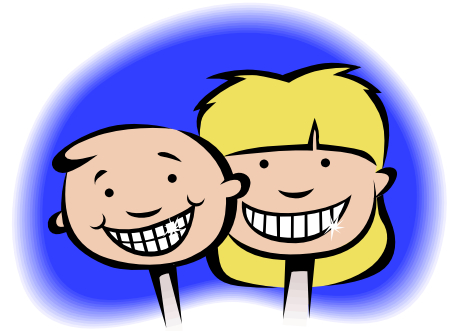


Dental Programs and Services For York Region Elementary Schools

Dental Screening and Referral

Information letters for parents about this program will be forwarded to your school.

Please distribute a copy to **ALL students** to take home several weeks prior to dental screening at your school.



Why do we do dental screening?

- Screening is mandated by the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care's Child Health Program under the Ontario Public Health Standards (2008), which are published pursuant to Section 7 of the *Health Protection and Promotion Act*.
- Children can develop dental problems, which their parents may not be aware of.
- Screening provides an opportunity to inform parents of any dental problems that exist and, if they cannot afford dental care for their child, to inform them of the Children in Need of Treatment (CINOT) program.

What do we do?

- Dental screening is provided to children in selected grades, determined by Ministry of Health and Long term Care Protocols, plus others as required. Any child who was funded for dental care through the CINOT program the previous year is also screened.
- Screening consists of a quick visual inspection by a dental hygienist, using a separate sterilized mirror for each child.
- Current and appropriate infection control measures are followed.
- If problems are seen, parents are notified that dental treatment may be required.
- We are required by law to follow-up on any urgent dental conditions.

What do we need?

- A clean room or private area with an electrical outlet, two tables and three chairs

Oral Health Assessment and Surveillance

An oral health assessment and surveillance is carried out each year on all children who are screened. It is conducted simultaneously with dental screening. Data is used to determine the prevalence of dental disease and to assess preventive and treatment needs in York Region. It is used locally for program planning and to assess the oral health status of children in our community. Data is also analysed provincially to provide insight into the oral health status of children in Ontario, as well as comparatively by region.

Funded Dental Programs

1. Children in Need of Treatment (CINOT) Program

Dental treatment may be covered under this program for children up to their 18th birthday if:

- a child has been identified by a York Region dental hygienist as having an urgent dental condition.
- the family has no dental insurance
- and the cost of care would create a financial hardship

2. The Ontario Works Dental program

This program provides basic dental care to dependant children up to 18 years of age, whose parents receive assistance through the Ontario Works or Ontario Disability Support Program.

What you can do if a child complains of a dental problem, e.g. toothache

- Notify the parents/guardians of your concern
- If they indicate that providing dental care for their child is difficult due to the cost and they do not have dental insurance, suggest they contact the Dental Program to arrange for a screening at one of our Community and Health Services Dental Clinics by calling (905) 895-4512 or 1-800-735-6625.

Individual Preventive Program

If a child would benefit from preventive care, the following services are offered:

- Topical fluoride
- Sealants
- Cleaning and oral hygiene instruction

Information about the proposed services and a medical history form will be sent to the parents. Clinics are held in schools where sufficient number of students would make transporting our portable dental equipment to the school cost-effective. If not, parents will be offered appointments for their children at one of the three clinics below.

School Clinic requirements:

- Space about 10 feet by 10 feet with an electrical outlet
- Two tables and three chairs
- Portable dental equipment (delivered by York Region Health Services)

Dental Health Education
