This memo provides a summary of comments received on the Transportation Master Plan (TMP) as part of the Public Review period and includes a list of the changes made as a result of these comments.

## The Council endorsed TMP was made available for public review

Council endorsed the TMP on June 23, 2016. The TMP and associated background reports were made available for public review on July 21, 2016. The TMP report, maps and associated background reports were available at local municipal offices, through the Office of the Regional Clerk and online at york.ca/tmp. The public review period ended September 15, 2016.

## Fourteen individuals, landowners and agencies provided comments during the review period

Comments on the TMP were received during the public review from 14 individuals, landowners and agencies. Attachment 1 lists the agencies and provides a summary of all comments received as well as information regarding any actions resulting from those comments.

The comments received included requests for clarification, changes to network maps and clarification changes to the TMP document. The Toronto and Region Conservation Authority requested changes to the project sheets for consistency with the TMP, where changes were incorporated based on their review of the draft TMP. The Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry acknowledged that the Region's revisions to the draft TMP strengthened the protection of natural systems while expressing concerns for several specific projects. These comments will be included in the project-specific Environmental Assessments. Staff conducted final reviews of the document in conjunction with the Public Review. Comments were received from the following departments:

- Community and Health Services (Public Health)
- Corporate Services (Legal and Long Range Planning)
- Transportation Services

Several of the comments received have resulted in minor changes to the Executive Summary, 2016 Transportation Master Plan and associated maps.
