Recommendation

It is recommended that:

1. The attached 2014 – 2024 Business Plan of York Region Rapid Transit Corporation be received for information.

Purpose

The 2014-2024 Business Plan provides:

- A six month review of 2013 funded capital project achievements and 2014/2015 project goals.
- A five year summary of goals and objectives for the funded projects.
- A one, five and ten year summary of goals and objectives for unfunded rapid transit projects.
- A one, five and ten year summary of goals and objectives for rapid transit development and strategic operations projects.

Background

YRRTC's initial 10-year business plan was approved by the Board in January 2010

 In January 2010, the YRRTC Board of Directors approved the initial 2010-2020 business plan to guide the execution of the vivaNext Rapid Transit Plan.

- On an annual basis, the business plan is updated to maintain a 10-year outlook.
- This updated business plan is organized into funded and unfunded capital projects and provides development and strategic operations' goals.

Analysis

VivaNext Rapid Transit System Network:



On target to achieve 2014 business objectives

YRRTC is focused on achieving its 2014 business objectives as outlined in the business plan:

Bus Rapidways & Stations

- Highway 7 East (H3) commission and open for operation the section east of the Hwy. 404 area to Warden Station.
- Davis Drive (D1) complete draining works, utility relocation and undertake roadway surface construction activity.
- Highway 7 West Vaughan Metropolitan Centre (H2-VMC) begin utility and construction activities on the west end. Finalize design, complete property acquisition and begin utility relocation on the east end.
- Yonge Street (Y2.1, Y2.2, Y3.2) award the Design-Build contract, continue land acquisition and procure services to fulfill property offers.

Facilities and Terminals

- Operations, Maintenance and Storage Facility (OMSF) 80% construction completion.
- Cornell Terminal secure site and amend contribution agreement, issue RFP for architect services, and begin preliminary design.
- SmartCentres Terminal Vaughan Metropolitan Centre finalize capital budget, Architect's Agreement and Bus Terminal Agreement, and complete preliminary design process.

Buses

 Accept delivery of remaining 15 new Nova Bus vehicles in the first quarter of 2014 out of the planned 39 buses. This will bring the Viva fleet to 123 buses – consisting of 40 – forty-foot buses and 83 sixtyfoot buses.

<u>Subways</u>

- Toronto-York Spadina Subway Extension (TYSSE) continue to build stations and hold media event to mark milestones.
- Yonge Subway Extension complete Tail Track TPAP amendment, collaborate on Metrolinx's Network Relief Study and report out on the Investment Strategy implementation.

The 2014 – 2024 Business Plan is a blueprint to guide the major activities of the York Region Rapid Transit Corporation

 The 10-year update business plan is refreshed on an annual basis and supplemented by our regular project status quarterly reports and annual report.

Conclusion

- The business plan reflects the Provincial capital budget allocation to the rapid transit system.
- Funded projects are moving forward and on target to meet project goals.
- Unfunded projects will continue to be advanced where possible to maintain readiness.
- YRRTC is on target to achieve the 2014 business objectives as outlined in the business plan.
- YRRTC will continue to work with internal and external stakeholders to ensure adherence to critical project timelines as the various project segments move forward.

Cost Confidence Bundle Segments: H3, D1, H2-VMC	Project Overview — H3 - Highway 7 East in the City of Markham and Town of Richmond Hill is the segment of rapidway from Bayview Avenue to Warden Avenue at Enterprise Boulevard, via South Town Centre Boulevard and Cedarland Drive which is approximately 6.3 kilometres. There is one curb-side station at Bayview Avenue, and 10 centre-lane vivastations at Chalmers, Valleymede, West Beaver Creek, Leslie, East Beaver Creek, Allstate, Woodbine, Montgomery, South Town Centre and Cedarland. 
