

PRELIMINARY SITE PLAN


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The design is very preliminary and will be finalized over the coming months.

(DESIGN SUBJECT TO CHANGE)




Preliminary Design Components:

- Passive House design
- Wrap-around programming and services
- 5 storeys + basement in height
- 30 to 40 emergency housing units
 - Bachelor units
 - Shared kitchen and washrooms
- 10 to 26 transitional housing units
 - Mix of bachelor and 3-bdrm units
 - Individual kitchens and washrooms
- Ground-floor amenity space
- Basement-floor amenity space
- Outdoor amenity space


BUILDING MASS MODEL — VIEW 2
