

- Community support





























CONTEXT: EMERGENCY AND TRANSITIONAL HOUSING



BACKGROUND

- For most residents, York Region is a vibrant place to live and work, yet for a small number of people, the experience of homelessness is a daily reality
- Men experiencing or at risk of homelessness in York Region come from many different backgrounds and life circumstances
- Factors leading to homelessness can include:
 - Rising housing costs and limited affordable housing options
 - Illness, personal or family crisis
 - Job loss or reduced hours of work



CURRENT LANDSCAPE: MEN'S EMERGENCY HOUSING

- Men's Shelter beds operated by Blue Door Support Services
- Building owned by Housing York Inc. and co-located on same property as Leeder Place Family Shelter


- Property acquired by York Region in the 1980s
- Original building over 100 years old with several additions and renovations



EFFECTIVE PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Creating a Multi-Service Building

- Short-term emergency housing and longer-term transitional housing
- Supportive counselling and life-skills
- Help to find and keep permanent housing
- Referrals to community supports and resources
- Supports to develop financial literacy, education, training and job search
- Implementing a proven successful service delivery model



CO-LOCATION WITH PUMPING STATION




HENDERSON PUMPING STATION


 York Region completed a Schedule B Class Environmental Assessment for the pumping station in 2019


 The pumping station is required to address sewage capacity constraints in the Aurora servicing area


- This new pumping station will ensure York Region can meet operational demands during extreme wet weather events
- Public Consultations were held on November 2018 and February 2019
- Site Plan Approval was obtained in April 2021
- Construction will begin in Summer 2021 and finish Spring 2023



HENDERSON PUMPING STATION







THE OPPORTUNITY

- Centrally located site, with access to transit
- Site is sufficient to include emergency and transitional housing
- A Zoning By-law Amendment (i.e., Rezoning) and Site Plan Application will likely be required to permit this specific use
- Town policies and regulations permit a four to six storey building, depending on the zoning proposed
- Planning and public engagement processes will help define the building form and features
