

# 2019 Community Investment Fund Results

The Community Investment Fund supports non-profit agencies for the delivery of community services that improve the well-being of York Region residents living with low and moderate income through four Community Result Areas.

Residents live in affordable, adequate and suitable housing



## HOUSING STABILITY

**2,253** were educated on landlord and tenant rights

**807** were able to prevent eviction

**629** received safe and supportive services through seasonal shelters in winter 2018/2019

Two service providers offered seasonal shelters to individuals in need for a total of **283** nights

## COMMUNITY HEALTH

**646** were more aware of mental health supports and services

**23,630** residents were served by the Food Bank of York Region

**235** participated in cooking classes to learn how to prepare healthy meals

**254** participated in inter-generational programming

**1,212** reported feeling respected and welcomed in the programs

**1,193** reported increased confidence, self-esteem or well-being

After completing their programs, **449** enrolled in further education (trade-school, college)

**1,417** completed internships and skills training
