# **2021** Community Investment Fund Results

The Community Investment Fund supports non-profit agencies to deliver community services for York Region residents living with low and moderate income under four Community Result Areas. These services adapted and remained critical to the 2021 pandemic response.



\* Regional Council approved **\$1 million** in one-time additional funding to address increased community needs and service gaps due to COVID-19.

The COVID-19 Coordination (3C) initiative, a joint partnership with United Way Greater Toronto, continued to provide collaborative responses through three community working groups addressing emergency food access, homelessness and seniors services.

**155** community and social service stakeholders, community members or peers participated in four **Community Action Tables across** York Region to support safety and well-being.



208 community agency staff attended five professional development sessions, with a session being dedicated to mental health supports.

**477** people participated in intergenerational programs 90% of program participants reported feeling respected and welcomed in the programs

90% of program participants reported increased confidence self-esteem or well-being



COVID-19 Relief funding supported a 17% expansion in social inclusion programs for an additional 375 people to participate

**100** people living with mental health challenges were assisted with the application process for the Ontario Disability Support Program



84 people, at-risk of experiencing domestic violence, received legal support through COVID-19 Relief funding and 39 people retained housing through community mediation funded by the provincial **Social Services Relief Fund**
