Thank you for your continued interest in the community housing development at <u>5676 Main Street in the Town</u> of Whitchurch-Stouffville.

As we move into the holiday season and get ready to wrap-up this year, we'd like to share some highlights from 2022. Your input, along with support from the community and our partners, has played an important part in this work.

Project Update

On site, construction continues. The underground hydro connections are complete and foundation work is underway. Over the months ahead, crews will pour the concrete slab, install the grade beams, water connections and waterproofing. The ground floor structure will start to take shape. The building is expected to welcome the first residents in spring 2024 and will provide 97 homes for seniors, families, couples and singles.

The new year ahead presents many opportunities to build on the progress made so far. We will continue to keep you informed throughout all stages of the project.

Construction in Kilograms

Foundation caissons

Caissons are drilled holes in the ground that are reinforced and filled with concrete and provide a base for the structure.

- 3,000,000+ kilograms of concrete poured
- 8,000+ kilograms of rebar used

Foundation grade beams

Foundation grade beams are part of the building's foundation and span between caissons.

- 595,000+ kilograms of concrete poured
- 44,000+ kilograms of rebar/steel bars used



Emergency and Transitional Housing Developments

In addition to building community housing, York Region is constructing new emergency and transitional housing developments. As winter begins, the need for emergency and transitional housing remains high in our communities, and many individuals and families struggle to secure safe and affordable housing.

To help people keep and find housing, York Region recently opened Passage House, an 18-unit transitional housing building for adult men in the Town of East Gwillimbury. The Bridge in the Town of Georgina provides duplex style housing units for youth and is nearing completion. Visit york.ca/RapidHousing for more information.
