COMMUNITY VIOLENCE PREVENTION FUNDING

KFY ACTIONS FACT SHEET

The York Region Community Violence Prevention Funding supports the implementation of the Region's <u>Community Safety and Well-Being (CSWB) Plan</u> by building community capacity to undertake proactive and targeted community-based and culturally appropriate initiatives. Actions supported by the funding are linked to the priority areas of mental well-being, housing stability and economic stability to reduce underlying risk factors that can lead to youth crime, harm and victimization (including involvement in gangs and gang violence).

In alignment with the <u>CSWB Plan</u>, the funding supports the four identified geographic focus areas within the Regional Municipality of York:

- 1. Northern Georgina
- 2. Central Newmarket
- 3. South-central Markham; and
- 4. South-central Richmond Hill (including the City of Vaughan)

Projects funded by the Community Violence Prevention Funding supports all youth residents, especially those ages 6-26 years who are Indigenous, Black, young women, LGBTQ2S+, immigrant and/or refugee youth.

After two years, a program evaluation and impact assessment will be conducted to inform ongoing program needs.



HOW IT WORKS

Projects supported by Community Violence Prevention Funding should be informed by consultations and/or needs assessments with youth, and can include:

- Trauma-informed programming
- Employment development and supports
- Community engagement activities
- Indigenous services and/or programming
- Supports focused around Black youth

- Gender based programming
- Hate motivated incident awareness/ prevention
- Leadership development programming
- Mental health programming and supports

Agencies and grassroots organizations may apply for up to \$100,000 per funding request. Residents may apply for up to \$4,000. Funding is available for up to 1 year, with the potential for renewal through the monitoring and reporting process of the agreement. The total available budget for this funding is approximately \$2 million from now until March 2026.



BENEFITS

- Enables actions, including those from the Community Action Tables, to be successfully planned and implemented
- Builds capacity in grassroots groups who may not have had access to funding previously
- Increases proactive and culturally appropriate supports and activities

CAN GRASSROOTS ORGANIZATIONS APPLY?

Organizations without legal not-for-profit or charitable status and annual audited financial statements will be required to work with a trustee organization to access funding.
