PRACTICE RESOURCE: When to Use Publicly Funded Tubersol®

As of July 2023

York Region health care providers often ask when publicly funded tuberculin skin test (TST) solution (Tubersol®) can be used for screening clients for Tuberculosis (TB) TST screening. This resource clarifies the eligibility criteria and explains when to use publicly funded Tubersol®.

PUBLICLY FUNDED TUBERSOL® MAY BE USED FOR PATIENTS WHO MEET **AT LEAST ONE**OF THE FOLLOWING ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

✓ Contacts of active TB cases

Tubersol® is used for screening contacts of an active TB case. One of York Region Public Health's roles with TB prevention and control is case and contact management activities. No fees are to be charged to clients for the administration of the TST and/or for the completion of TB-related forms when they are contacts of an active TB case.

✓ Patients for whom TB screening with TST is deemed to be "medically necessary" by their health care provider

For patients who have underlying medical conditions, medically necessary TSTs may also be required. A list of those at higher risk for TB disease may be found in the <u>Canadian Tuberculosis Standards</u>, <u>8th Edition</u>; <u>Chapter 4: Diagnosis of tuberculosis infection</u>, <u>Table 2</u>. No fees are to be charged to clients for the administration of the TST and/or for the completion of TB-related forms.

✓ Residents under the age of 65 who are being admitted into long-term care facilities Universal TB testing for the purpose of screening prior to admission into a long-term care facility is not recommended for residents 65 years of age and older. In case of exposure to tuberculosis, testing for TB infection is to be applied on a case-by-case basis. No fees are to be charged to clients for the administration of the TST and/or for the completion of TB-related forms.

✓ Students who require TB screening for school

Students of educational institutions requiring TB screening as part of the admission or continuation of education relating to daycare or pre-school programming, or a program of study in a school, community college, university, or other educational institution, including any work placement(s) that are part of the student's curriculum. The TB screening must be a requirement of the educational institution and should be included on the documentation to be completed for submission to the school. No fees are to be charged to clients for the administration of the TST and/or for the completion of TB-related forms.

✓ Students participating in work placement

Students who require TB screening for work placements must provide documentation that confirms the placement is a component of their school curriculum. No fees are to be charged to clients for the administration of the TST and/or for the completion of TB-related forms.

✓ International students

Screening of international students who are required by their educational institution to complete TB screening. Costs associated with the administration and reading of a TST are not covered and fees associated with these interventions must be billed to the international student or a third party. It should be noted that no fees are to be charged to clients for the cost of the publicly funded Tubersol[®].

PUBLICLY FUNDED TUBERSOL® MUST **NOT** BE USED IN THE FOLLOWING SCENARIO:

Clients who request/require TB screening solely for employment purposes (paid or voluntary) are not eligible for:

- Publicly funded Tubersol[®]
- · Administration of the test, and
- Completion of related documents eligible for public funding (through OHIP)

Your office may acquire Tubersol® privately and bill these patients accordingly. Alternatively, a client may acquire Tubersol® from a pharmacy through a valid prescription from their health care provider. Costs incurred for the administration of TST and reading in this situation and the completion of related documents are to be directed to the client or a third party as directed by the client.

Individuals who are not insured through OHIP are not eligible for publicly funded TB screening. If your client is not insured through OHIP, contact York Region Public Health's TB Intake Line at 1-877-464-9675 ext. 76000 to assess if they are eligible for the TB Diagnostic and Treatment Services for Uninsured Persons (TB-UP) Program.
