- ☐ A green Proof of Public Health Inspection sign is posted at the spa/salon
- ☐ The service provider is knowledgeable and experienced in the service they are providing
- ☐ The service provider washes their hands before and after each service
- The service provider applies skin antiseptic from a single-use packet or onto a cotton swab/cotton ball and then onto the skin
- ☐ The service provider checks the client's skin for open cuts, wounds, and signs of infection. If found, service is refused
- ☐ The service provider wears disposable gloves on both hands during the service and cleans hands immediately after taking off gloves
- The service provider sets up supplies and opens packaged equipment in front of the client just before the service begins. This includes sterilized tools and single-use equipment, which must be used on one person only
- ☐ Needles are not saved for reuse on the same client
- ☐ The following list of items are used on one client only, then thrown away
 - Cotton pads, tissues, wipes
 - Facial sponges
 - Microneedling needles, derma roller heads, needle cartridges
 - Personal protective equipment (i.e., gloves, eye protection)
 - Plastic covers
 - Single-use ointment applicators
- ☐ The following list of items are cleaned and disinfected between each client
 - Bowls
 - Clip cords
 - Facial brushes
 - Facial steamer machine and reservoir
 - Reusable microneedle roller handles
 - Reusable microneedling pen
 - Service trays
 - Spatulas
 - Squeeze bottles
 - Table, chairs, beds
- ☐ Needles and needle cartridges must be sterile, with lot numbers and expiry dates
- ☐ Tools and supplies are stored in a clean area (e.g., in covered containers)
- Equipment and surfaces used are in good repair (e.g., no rust, cracks, etc.)





The service provider must provide verbal and written aftercare instructions including infection risks and a recommendation to see a doctor within 24 hours should an infection occur
Canadian Standards Association approved sharps container must be located at point of use for safe disposal of the sharps
Clean sheets, towels, robes etc. are used for each client. Paper liners are thrown out after each use
Products, such as creams and lotions should be dispensed with a pump or single-use applicator to prevent contamination of the original product (no double dipping or fingers in jars)
