Summary Description of the IPAC Lapse

- Colon hydrotherapy device used on clients was constructed from repurposed parts rather than an approved medical device legally authorized for sale in Canada. As a result, it lacked a Manufacturer's Instructions for Use (MIFU) and the required procedures for proper cleaning, disinfection, waste management, and protection of the municipal water supply.
- Cleaning and disinfection of reusable equipment was not performed in accordance with the "PIDAC Best Practices for Cleaning, Disinfection and Sterilization of Medical Equipment/Devices in All Health Care Settings, 3rd Edition, May 2013".
- Hand hygiene was not performed in accordance with the "PIDAC Best Practices for Hand Hygiene in All Health Care Settings, 4th Edition, April 2014".

- Use medical devices with Manufactures Instructions for Use (MIFU) that include validated cleaning, disinfection, and waste management procedures, aligned with regulatory standards and infection prevention control best practices, and install a certified backflow preventor to protect the municipal water source.
- Provide hand hygiene facilities and perform hand hygiene in accordance with the "PIDAC Best Practices

for Hand Hygiene in All Health Care Settings, 4th Edition, April 2014".
