

# Update – 2025-2026 Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) Prevention Program

March 27, 2026

Current RSV percent positivity and hospitalization data indicate continuing community transmission. While RSV positivity in Ontario peaked among young children during the week of January 18, positivity rates vary across the province and remain high overall, particularly among infants and young children.

**As a result, Ontario’s RSV prevention program for infants and high-risk children will be extending into April 2026.**

- Please continue to order and/or administer RSV immunizations (Beyfortus/Nirsevimab) to [eligible infants and children](#) until further communication is released to mark the end of the 2025-2026 program
- When considering maternal vaccination, please account for both the recommended gestational window for administration (32–36 weeks gestation) and the anticipated end of the season. If administering the maternal vaccination into April, the doses will be publicly funded
- Guidance for the 2026-2027 program will be provided leading up to the fall and will include recommendations for those infants and children who receive RSV protection late this season

## Ordering RSV Products

- Please check expiry dates and use existing stock before placing additional orders
  - After March 31, please dispose of any unadministered Abrysvo, Lot LL7267 doses that were ordered for older adults
- Any remaining end of season unexpired RSV Ab (Beyfortus/Nirsevimab) stock should be maintained between +2.0°C and +8.0°C in your fridge and not returned, as it may be used in future RSV seasons

A vaccine refrigeration unit temperature log with a minimum of the most current five (5) business days of temperature recordings must be submitted with each vaccine order form.
