






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Central LHIN September 2015



What is a Priority Neighbourhood?

Neighbourhoods that showed:

- 1) High utilization of health care services:
- 2) Low cancer screening rates and/or high prevalence of chronic disease
- 3) Poor socioeconomic status:
 - High proportion of population age 65+ living alone
 - Lowest average household income levels

Examples of Priority Projects in York Region

- **Seniors Care** (enhancing home care, assisted living, adult day programming, dementia strategy, respite, caregiver supports, alternatives for LTCHs (e.g. creative use of retirement homes)
- Palliative Care and Residential Hospices Margaret Bahen Hospice: 10 beds opening in Nov 2017, Hospice Vaughan plan for 10 beds in 2019
- **Strengthened Community Care** Integrated Care Coordination (e.g. Health Links), Digital Health, care coordination solutions, inter-professional team models
- Mental Health and Addictions Mental Health Hub (emerging), coordinated Opioid Strategy, anticipation of 108 supportive housing units
- Indigenous health planning and engagement (Georgina Council, Indigenous Cultural Safety Training)
- **Hospital** redevelopment planning and expansions new Mackenzie Vaughan hospital projected to open in 2021

Central LHIN Addictions & Opioid Strategy







Sub-Region Collaborative Planning Tables

Focus on working collectively to identify, plan and implement change opportunities that address unique sub-region challenges in alignment with provincial priorities and local need. Sub-region planning tables will be tasked to:

- ✓ Create strong local and regional partnerships to improve local access to care;
- ✓ Define opportunities to improve service delivery, build capacity and improve integration across the healthcare system that facilitates seamless transitions for patients, caregivers and providers;
- ✓ Work together with the LHIN to locally engage with residents, patients and other system partners to best understand sub-region needs at the neighbourhood level;
- ✓ Prepare recommendations for implementation to improve local care that is aligned with the Patients First Mandate as identified in Central LHIN sub-region reports and summaries;
- ✓ Plan, implement and monitor local improvements
