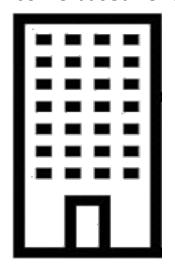
Board Workshop #3 - Recap

100% geared to income rents



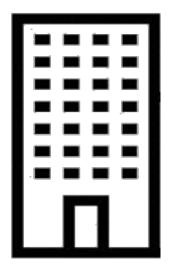
- High annual Regional subsidy costs
- Break even budget

Mix of market and income based rents



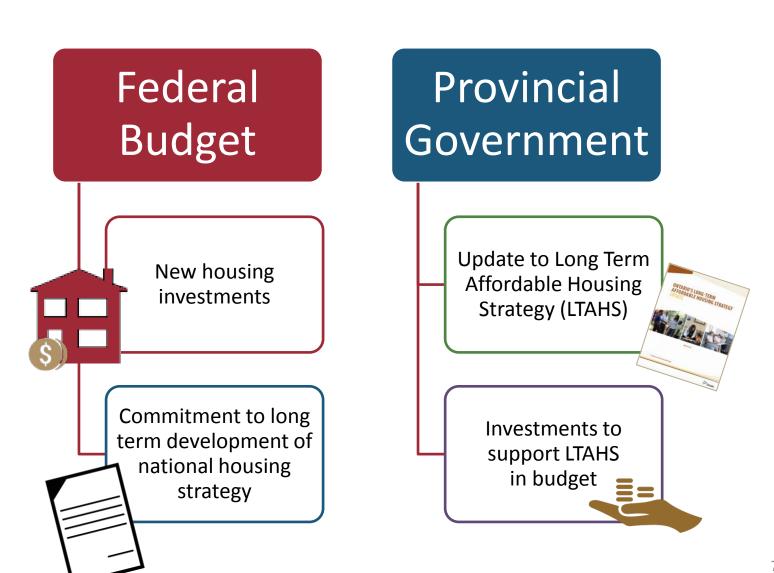
- Capital funding required
- Modest revenue surplus

100% full market rent



- May require capital funding

Strengthen Community Health



- Formalize partnerships and/or invest in direct service
- Engage tenants more often and on a broader range of HYI policies and programs
- Explore opportunities for social enterprise, skills development programs, and innovative service delivery hubs

Strengthen Community Health

Consultation and Research:

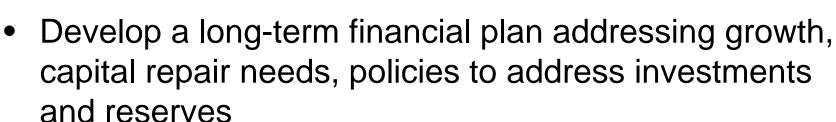
- What capacity do partners have to enhance service?
- What services would tenants prioritize?
- What opportunities do we have to leverage health and community investments from senior levels of government?



Build Long-Term Financial Sustainability

- Develop rent model options for Woodbridge and the Hub
- Explore opportunities to increase market rent revenues
- Explore opportunities to create "profit for purpose" to reinvest for social good





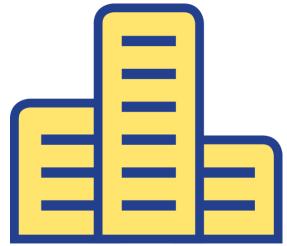
Build Long-Term Financial Sustainability

Consultation and Research:

- Engage Regional treasury department to ensure alignment with Regional fiscal strategy
- Explore opportunities to work through the Canadian Housing Bank
- Explore leveraging opportunities within the existing portfolio
- Engage potential partners to explore additional revenue opportunities

Effectively Manage Assets

- Enhance preventative maintenance and energy efficiency programs
- Continue to enhance long term asset management planning
- Explore opportunities to work with local municipalities to partner on development opportunities



Effectively Manage Assets

Consultation and Research:

 Engage local municipalities to explore opportunities arising from Long Term Affordable Housing Strategy initiatives

- Enhance preventative maintenance, asset management, and energy efficiency programs (consult front-line staff on opportunities to increase efficiency and enhance asset management)
- Continue current redevelopment initiatives and examine existing portfolio for opportunities for intensification and/or redevelopment

Provide Good Governance and Strengthen Organizational Capacity



- Establish vision and mission statements
- Develop performance management framework
- Develop Enterprise Risk Management Framework
- Strengthen business processes and communications with technology enhancements

Provide Good Governance and Strengthen Organizational Capacity

Consultation and Research:

- Coordinate a Board workshop to develop the mission and vision statements
- Engage staff and Regional partners to inform enhancement of performance and risk management systems
- Review current technology and identify future needs in collaboration with Regional partners

Support and Inform Regional Housing Initiatives

 Housing York is the largest housing provider in the Region, operating 39% of the units in the overall portfolio

> Housing York is ideally positioned to explore housing policy and program options to inform the development of staff reports to Regional Council

Support and Inform Regional Housing Initiatives

- Inform development of income and asset limit polices for all subsidized units
- Explore affordable home ownership options
- Prepare for future federal/ provincial policy initiatives and investments
- Enhance access to housing and supports for applicants
- Facilitate access to mental health supports for tenants

Support and Inform Regional Housing Initiatives

Consultation and Research:

- Research implications of a range of asset and income limits for rent subsidy
- Consult Non-Profit and Co-operative Housing Providers and seek the Housing York Board's advice on asset and income limits options prior to seeking Council approval
- Monitor evolving provincial policy and federal investment announcements
