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# Smoke Free Policy Purpose



#### **Purpose:**

Reduce tenants' exposure to second hand smoke, while respecting the rights of existing tenants who chose not to enter into a nosmoking unit lease

#### **Additional Benefits:**

- Decreased unit turnover costs for non-smoking units
- Support for Strategic Plan objective of sustaining healthy communities
- Decreased fire risk

### Limitations in Setting Smoke-Free Policy

- The Residential Tenancies Act, 2006, (RTA) governs the relationship between landlords and tenants.
- Can legally adopt a non-smoking policy as long as doesn't conflict with the RTA, Human Rights code or other laws
- The Smoke-Free Ontario Act, 2006 prohibits smoking in the common areas of Housing York buildings for both new and existing tenants

## Who can it be applied to?

- No-smoking policy may only apply to new tenants signing new leases
  - All tenants in new buildings
  - New tenants in existing buildings
- Existing tenants must be grandfathered

### Summary of Policy

- Effective November 1, 2014
- Prohibits smoking in units, on balconies, patios and from front and back yards of townhouse units
- Policy applies to occupants and their guests
- New and existing tenants <u>cannot</u> smoke within 5 metres of windows, doors or vents
- Exemptions for medical marijuana and traditional use of tobacco by indigenous persons

### Policy Implementation

#### Roll Out:

- Comprehensive training for staff
- Robust communication strategy for existing tenants
- Communications to applicants and updates to online resources
- Program and supports for tenants on smoking cessation

#### Post Implementation:

- Two new smoke-free buildings added, 239 units
- Over 300 existing units have become smoke free
- Series of training programs offered

### Policy Review

- Explore options to strengthen existing policy
  - Research industry best practices and trends
  - Analyze the legislative implications of e-cigarettes
  - Revisit 5m perimeter for smoking outside buildings
- Review procedures
  - Policy enforcement
  - Review options where smoking is interfering with reasonable enjoyment
  - Review procedures related to oxygen use in units
- Develop further opportunities to raise awareness about safety issues related to smoking
- Explore initiatives related to smoking cessation
