Hi Tara,

"I live on the South side of Mount Albert. We do have a crosswalk to actually cross the road, but have only ever had a vehicle stop for me once. The sight lines are really bad, the crest of the hill is actually further east so I have to listen for cars rather than seeing them, not to mention they're usually doing over 70km, and some of them are dump trucks.

As a pedestrian in the crosswalk, we do have the right of way, I'm wondering how I can petition to get crosswalk lights installed? This would at least be visible before cresting the hill and may slow down drivers.

I am aware that there is not a large number of pedestrians that currently cross the road; but I'm thinking with some of the older, established houses getting sold, there will be an influx of new children. (I'm aware of 3 young couples that have moved onto centre in the past 18 months, one of which has since started a family.)"

Last week I took a few picture of the intersection and the bad sight lines, which I have attached to this email. As I was taking the photos, once again, there were no vehicles that stopped while I crossed the street.
