

CHILD CARE SETTING

Cleaning and Disinfecting Schedule

Cleaning and disinfecting are the building blocks of an infection prevention and control program in a child care setting. Some pathogens can live for hours, days or even weeks on toys, equipment and other surfaces. To reduce the spread of pathogens in the child care setting, adhere to a daily two-step cleaning and disinfecting process.

This schedule provides the minimum frequency requirements that apply to normal child care setting operating conditions. When there is increased illness in the centre or an outbreak is declared, extra cleaning and disinfecting will be necessary.

Please note that additional public health measures may be advised during an outbreak or pandemic by YRPH and the Ministry of Education.
