

ELECTRONIC WASTE (E-WASTE)

E-waste is electronic equipment that no longer works and cannot be repaired. Electronic waste should not be thrown in the garbage, as there are many components that can be recycled, and some are considered hazardous. Electronics in working condition are reusable and should be donated.

Examples of E-waste include:

- Cameras
- Cables
- Computer towers, laptops and modems
- Game systems
- Monitors, printers and scanners
- Radios, stereos and speakers

- Telephones, pagers and fax machines, cellphones
- Televisions, VCRs and DVD players

Guidelines and limits:

- Remove all packaging and batteries
- Residents may bring two televisions and four units of computer equipment per day
- Disassembled electronics will not be accepted

E-waste may be brought to any York Region waste depot (excludes Bloomington depot), free of charge.

Clear all personal information from all devices prior to drop-off

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW)

HHW is anything in your home that is corrosive, explosive, flammable or poisonous and is no longer needed. HHW does not belong in the garbage or down the drain.

Examples of HHW include:

- Batteries
- Cleaning products
- Compact fluorescent light bulbs and tubes
- Paints
- Perfume, nail polish and remover
- Pharmaceuticals
- Pressurized containers (propane tanks)
- Sharps (needles and syringes)
- Used motor oil and filters

Guidelines and limits:

- Containers (including jerry cans) may not be returned
- Industrial, commercial or institutional hazardous waste materials are not accepted
- Materials should be in original packaging or well-labeled
- Do not mix substances
- Sharps must be in puncture-proof containers
- Residents can drop off 60 litres of household hazardous waste per day
- Residents can drop off 20 compact fluorescent tubes per day

SCRAP METAL AND METAL APPLIANCES

Metal items and metal appliances can be dropped off for recycling. Please do not place pressurized containers in the scrap metal bin.

Examples of scrap metal/metal appliances include:

- Dryers and washers
- Microwave ovens
- Power tools
- Refrigerators and freezers
- Stoves

Guidelines and limits:

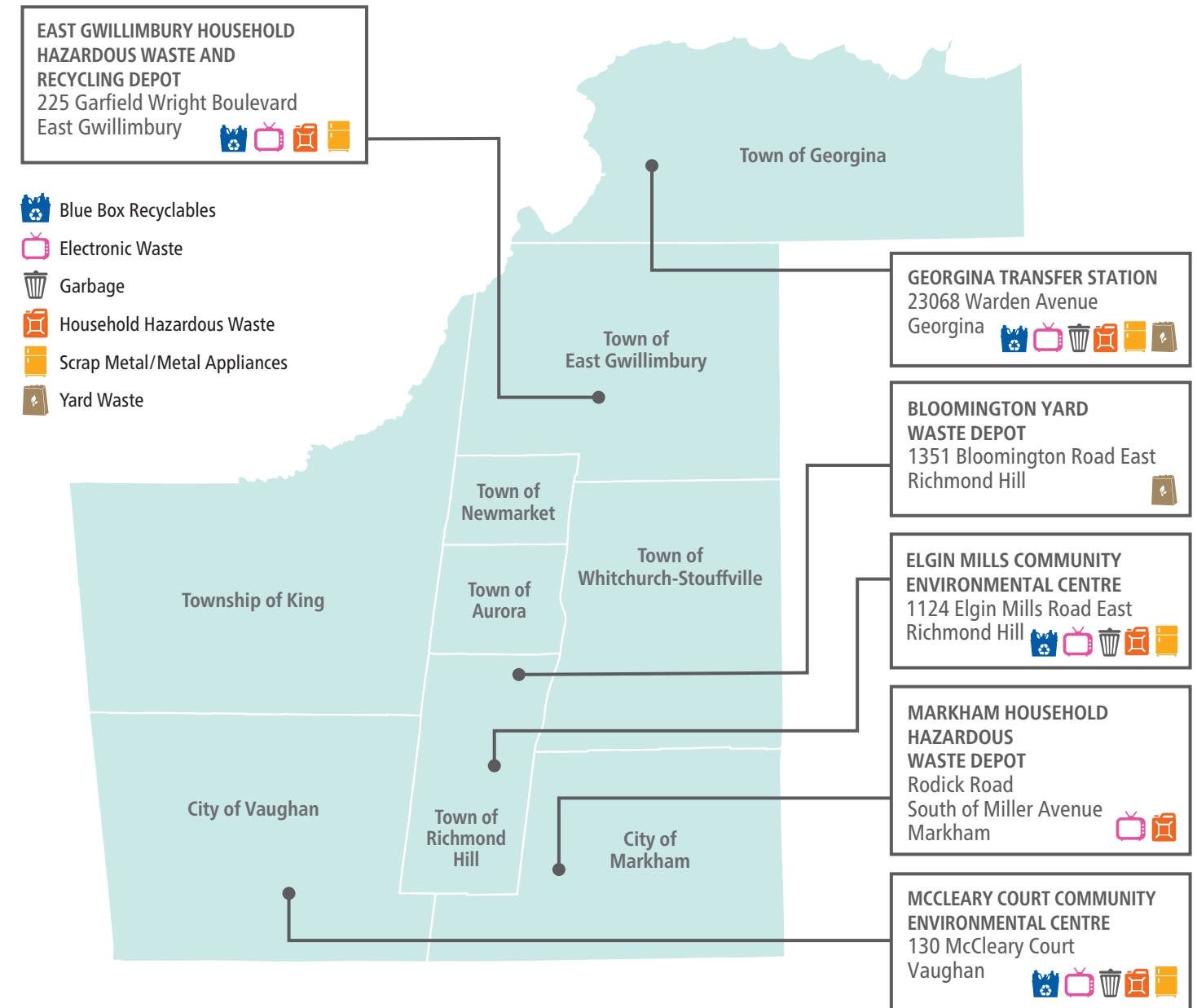
Refrigerated appliances such as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers can be dropped off with a valid CFC removal sticker (fees may apply). Appliances that **do not** have the sticker will be charged \$20 per unit.

Local towns and cities may offer a pick-up service for metal appliances. Please refer to your local municipal waste collection calendar or website for more information.

Bloomington Yard Waste Depot

Hours of Operation:

April 1 to November 30
Monday through Saturday 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.
Sunday Closed

December 1 - March 31
Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.
Saturday and Sunday Closed

Materials Accepted:

- Flowers and garden plants
- Grass clippings
- Hay (clean, small quantities)
- Leaves, shrubs, branches, weeds
- Sod (dirt removed, small residential quantities)

Yard waste in plastic bags must be emptied.

Materials Not Accepted:

- Animal droppings
- Branches larger than 15 cm in diameter or 1.8 m in length
- Kitchen and food waste
- Rocks, root balls, stumps, soil

Fees (cash, debit and credit accepted):

Residential	
Less than one cubic yard (up to 9 paper bags)	\$0
More than one cubic yard	\$65 per tonne
Commercial (business)	\$65 per tonne
